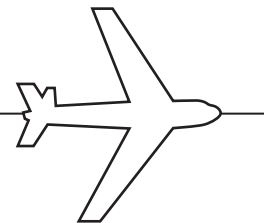


LEARN GERMAN IN GERMANY

HOW IT WORKS:

During the Spring semester take *Honors German 100* (2 credit hours - Spring 2009 W 4-6:30): Travel Orientation for Germany. The co/pre-requisite is *German 101* (3 credit hours - T/R 11:10 or 12:40 sections) or the equivalent.

If you took German in high school, take our online placement test to determine your language proficiency (<http://www.wku.edu/modernlanguages>).

During May Term 2009 travel to Berlin and take *Honors German 102 Abroad* (3 credit hours) and *Honors German 100* (1 credit hour).

You will earn 4 credit hours total while traveling abroad in Germany over May Term 2009!

In addition to class sessions, we will visit the German Parliament, the National Gallery of Art or Museum of Transportation and Technology, Sanssouci – Frederick the Great's Palace in Potsdam, the former concentration camp Sachsenhausen, schools and universities in Berlin, "Autostadt" Wolfsburg (VW), – and science-related destinations.

INCLUDED:

Airport transportation
Roundtrip flight from Nashville to Berlin, Germany
Local transit passes and train tickets
All 20 nights housing for (hostel and then with a host family)
Breakfast and lunch daily, some snacks
Guided tours, admissions, 2 concerts or plays

NOT INCLUDED:

Passport fee, International ID card, dinners, spending money
Study abroad tuition \$50/credit
