# 2008 Kentucky Licensing Regulations: Medication Administration

Kentucky implemented new licensing regulations, effective July 1, 2008 and it was expected that programs would be in full compliance with these new regulations as of October 1, 2008. With the revised regulations, some changes in regulation and interpretive guidelines were made in the area of Medication.

## What do the regulations say about Medication?

For licensed child care centers (Type I and Type II programs), the regulations regarding medication are found in 922 KAR 2:120 Child Care Center Health & Safety Standards Section 7, numbers 4-8. For Certified Family Child Care Homes, the requirements for medication are found in KAR 2:100 Section 13, numbers 1-4.

The regulations for both licensed and certified providers state the following:

- Prescription medication shall not be administered to a child in care, without daily written request of the parent.
- Non-prescription medication (over-the-counter) may be given to a child only with the written daily request of the parent or person exercising custodial control.
- Medications shall be administered according to the directions on the label.
- Medications (including refrigerated medications) must be stored in locked containers and out-of-reach of children.
- Medications must be kept in the original bottles and properly labeled.
- Medications should not be given if the expiration date on the bottle has passed.
- In licensed centers, there must be a written record of

the administration of the medicine that includes: the time, the date, the amount given, and the name of the staff person administering the medication.

## What does this mean for providers?

It means that all providers must obtain a signature and written request from the parent or person exercising custodial control each and every day that a medication is to be given. This includes both prescription and non-prescription (over-the-counter) medication. The written request for both types of medication must include the *name of the medicine*, the *name of the child* to receive the medication, the *time* the medicine is to be given, and the *amount* of medicine to be given.

It is important for all providers to know that NO medication can be labeled “as needed” for the time to be given. Many times, families want us to give a certain kind of medicine if they need it; however that is asking the teacher or administrator to make a medical judgment, which is not their role. Therefore, the daily permission form must be very specific about when to administer the medication. It is important for all providers to understand that they may not give medication to a child if the medication has not been signed in that day.



## What about Rescue Medications?

A rescue medication is a medication that must be administered in an emergency situation that occurs because of a medical condition affecting the child. Rescue medications can include epi-pens, inhalers, breathing treatments, and so forth.

Rescue medications will be given under direction of a physician; providers who work with the children with these medications need to obtain training in order to ensure that the medications are given appropriately and that providers understand the situations that may require the rescue medication. In these instances, parents may submit a general permission form allowing the program to administer the medication in such emergency situations. The written permission must include the same information - name of child, name of medication, and the amount of medication to be given.

## Is there anything else I need to know about the revised regulations and medication?

The revised regulations did make one exception to the daily written request requirement. This exception was made for both licensed and certified providers regarding the application of diaper creams and sunscreens. Both of these items are considered non-prescription medication and it is still required that written parental permission is given for providers to apply these two ointments. However, the written request does not have to be on a daily basis.

The written permission must be signed by the parent (or person exercising custodial control) and must be specific about the type of ointment (e.g., Boudreaux's Butt Paste, Banana Boat for Babies, etc), and the parent must designate a timeframe for applying that ointment. For example, "Apply at each diaper change; apply before going outside in the morning; etc."

It is important to note that the parent permission provided by the parent is **ONLY** good for that one tube or bottle so parents would have to provide a new permission form with each new tube or bottle of sunscreen or diaper cream. Also, if a parent changes brands of

diaper creams or sunscreens (e.g., switches to Triple Paste instead of Butt Paste), a new parent permission is required.



## What do I need to know about storing medication?

The regulations for both licensed and certified providers require that medication, refrigerated and non-refrigerated, must be kept in locked places, out of the reach of children. All of the medication must be kept in original bottles with proper labeling. For any non-prescription medication, providers must ensure that parents label the container with the child's name. It is important that providers keep a check on the medication storage boxes and ensure that there are no medications in the box that are expired or out-of-date.

## Who can help us understand how to meet this new regulation?

Staff members from of the Child Care Resource & Referral are available to programs to provide assistance not only in health and safety, but to provide additional assistance with understanding all of the new regulations as well as developmentally appropriate practices within early care and education. Information regarding the exceptions made to the written daily request of diaper creams and sunscreens can be found in the following regulations:

- Type I and Type II providers can find that in 922 KAR 2:120 Child Care Center Health & Safety Standards Section 7, number 5
- Certified Family Child Care Homes, the requirements for medication are found in KAR 2:100 Section 13, number 3

# We Provide the Parking Pass for Weekday Training!

Weekday parking on the WKU campus can be difficult. That's why the CCR&R provides free temporary WKU Visitor's Parking Passes for those pre-registering to attend CCR&R training on a weekday (Monday-Friday). Stickers can be picked up at Registration and should be placed on the driver's side dashboard of your car. Passes are valid only for the dates indicated on the pass. With a Visitor's Pass, you may park in all Non-Premium lots, including non-premium Faculty/Staff, Housing, Student, and Commuter Lots. You cannot park in Premium (i.e., gated) Lots, Handicapped Parking Slots, or Loading Zone slots, or in fire lanes or other parking-prohibited areas. (As always, parking on campus is not regulated after 5:00 and on weekends, so passes are not required for attending evening training or training on Saturdays.)

Although the CCR&R will have parking permits available for you at registration, you may still pick up on your own if you wish. Visitor parking permits are available at the WKU Transportation Office located at 578 Campbell Lane or at the Kentucky Museum on Kentucky Street.

# Training Reminders

## Training Required by Regulation:

Beginning July 1, 2008, the revised Kentucky Child Care Licensing Regulations require that each staff person at a Type I licensed program and Type II Family Child Care home receive 15 clock hours of training annually. Certified Family Child Care Home regulations now require 9 clock hours of training annually.

## Training Opportunities from the CCR&R:

The CCR&R at WKU provides monthly professional development training opportunities in a variety of formats and settings and on a variety of topics.

You may choose to attend training face-to-face at one of our training facilities. We offer Saturday conferences, as well as weekday and evening training opportunities. We even offer telephone conferences and e-mail training opportunities that you can complete at home or in your program! Be sure to look for the New Regulations series of telephone conferences that are scheduled throughout the year.

## Registering and Making Payment for Training:

As always, training registration forms are available in *THE CHILD CARE PROFESSIONAL*, the monthly newsletter published by the CCR&R. You may also register on-line at [www.wku.edu/ccrr-wku](http://www.wku.edu/ccrr-wku). No credit card is required to register on-line, but payment must be made by the date of training. Be sure to pay close attention to the training registration information:

- Cost of training varies depending on the session and when you register.
- Late registration is available if space is available; however, there is an additional \$5 fee.
- Registration must be received by the due date. Accounts that are not paid in full by the training date will be charged an additional \$15 late payment fee

per person, certificates will be held, and the person's seat at the training may be given to a paid participant on the waiting list.
