



Transfer Plan for an Associate Degree to WKU:

ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERSHIP, B.S.

Purpose: To promote transfer of credits from an Associate Degree from a regionally-accredited institution into the B.S. in Organizational Leadership from WKU.

Accreditation Status: Both institutions will observe regionally accreditation guidelines and procedures.

Admissions: Applicants for the Western Kentucky University's Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership are selected based upon the following criteria:

1. Graduate with an Associate Degree from a regionally-accredited institution.
2. No particular associate degree is specified.
3. If the Associate Degree is an A.A. or A.S. from a KCTCS institution then General Education courses at WKU are fulfilled.
4. Admission to WKU.
5. All transfer students must request that an official transcript from each college attended be sent to the WKU Admissions Office, 1906 College Heights Blvd. #11020, Bowling Green, KY 42101-1020, or preferable electronically, or call (270)745-2551 if you have questions. Application of Credits:

1. Students must complete WKU's General Education requirements and comply with all Academic Requirements and Regulations (as published in the undergraduate catalog). Additional general education coursework needed to fulfill WKU BS degree program may be taken through WKU or KCTCS.
2. Requires 48 semester hours of coursework. The degree is comprised of a 30 hour core and an 18 hour area of electives. Core and electives are proposed that will allow students with consent of advisor to select courses that are most applicable to leadership in their choice of careers. Additional electives may be proposed through the curricular process as demands dictate.
3. A table below outlines the requirements for a BS in Organizational Leadership, once the Associate Degree is completed.
