Endowment Match Program 2018-2019 Summary Report

This report covers the activities and expenditures supported at Western Kentucky University under the Endowment Match Program. Western Kentucky University submitted requests for all allocated matching funds to the Council on Postsecondary Education. These were disbursed before June 30, 2010. A total of \$14,211,209 has been requested since 1998; Council staff processed all of those requests and disbursed the entire amount to Western Kentucky University. WKU then transferred the funds to either the Western Kentucky University Foundation or the College Heights Foundation under custodial agreements. With these funds, the match program has helped create or expand a cumulative total of 79 endowments valued at \$36,909,862 as of June 30, 2019 (Table 7).

Since the program's inception in 1998, private donations and state matching funds supported the addition or expansion of two endowed chairs, 25 professorships, 15 scholarship funds and 37 mission support activities at Western Kentucky University (Table 1). As of June 30, all of those activities were operational.

Endowment Activity

As shown in Table 1, matching program funds were used to create two endowed chairs, 25 endowed professorships, 15 endowed scholarships and 37 mission support projects since its inception in 1998. Of these activities, the two chairs, the 25 professorships were occupied or

reporting expenditures, 15 of the scholarships made awards and 37 of the mission support projects reported expenditures. As of fiscal year-end, all 79 were active. Details concerning these chairs and professorships may be found on our website at www.wku.edu/bucks/index.php.

Demographic Information

The majority of the match program faculty recipients are female. As of June 30, 2019, a total of 32 visiting professors and WKU faculty were receiving honorariums or salary supplements through the program (see Table 2). The occupants of 20 of those positions (or 62.5 percent) were female and 12 (or 37.5 percent) were male.

The majority of chairs and professors supported through the program are white, non-Hispanics. As can be seen in Table 3, as of June 30, 2019, of the 32 match program faculty, 26 (or 81.25 percent) were white, one (or 3.12 percent) were black, three (or 9.37 percent) were Asian, one (or 3.12 percent) was American Indian and one (or 3.12 percent) were Hispanic. While the total number decreased, this represents a static percentage of minorities supported by the program.

Overall, the number of faculty employed through the match program decreased by one from fiscal year 2018 to fiscal year 2019. By the end of the year, 18.73 percent of all faculty supported with program funds were minorities. This represents a number basically the same as the percentage of minority faculty employed between fiscal year-end 2018 and 2019.

The number of students receiving financial aid awards through the program increased during 2018-2019 by 7 students. During the fiscal year, a total of 100 undergraduate and graduate students received scholarship awards that were funded with endowment proceeds (see Table 4).

Thirteen of the scholarship recipients (or 13 percent) were minority students, which is a slight decrease in percentage from last year. Four students chose not to identify by race.

In terms of gender, the majority of financial aid recipients were female. Over 32 of the 100 scholarship recipients (32 percent) were male and 68 were female (68 percent). The overall number of total scholarship recipients increased from 93 to 100 between fiscal years 2018 and 2019; the number of females increased from 64 to 68 and the number of male recipients also increased from 29 to 32.

Sources of Funds

During fiscal year 2018-19, Western Kentucky University did not receive any additional state funds through the Endowment Match Program (Table 6). All previous state funds were matched with cash gifts and pledges from private sources through the Western Kentucky University Foundation and College Heights Foundation. Since 1998, a total of \$33,700,606 in private and state funds was used to create or expand 79 endowments. Over half of the funds received from private sources was in cash or cash equivalent gifts (\$19,429,369 or 99.69 percent) and the remainder is in outstanding pledges (\$60,028 or .3 percent).

Areas of Concentration

The 2002-2004 Endowment Match Program Guidelines stipulate that 50 percent of any matching gifts and pledges received after October 1, 2003, must be used to support the Programs of Distinction at comprehensive institutions. All gifts and pledges used by WKU for this matching program were documented before this deadline. However, Western Kentucky University has two approved Programs of Distinction: The Center for the 21st Media and The Applied Research and Technology Program. Through June 30, 2019, Western Kentucky University received all \$14,211,209 of its 1998-2015 match program appropriation. That

amount was matched with \$19,489,397 in cash gifts and pledges, bringing the total amount of the 1998-2018 program funds to \$36,969,890. Of that amount, \$12,469,263 or 37.0 percent will be used to support positions in the Council on Postsecondary Education Programs of Distinction for WKU and \$9,519,049 or 28.2 percent will be used to support the new economy priority areas. Those priority areas include: Human Health and Development (18.4 percent), Biosciences (.3 percent), Materials Science and Advanced Manufacturing (0.0 percent), Information Technologies and Communications (10.1 percent), and Environmental and Energy Technologies (0.0 percent).

WKU's 2008-10 match program appropriation equals \$2,439,000. As of June 30, 2010, all requests were submitted and fully matched.

Earnings and Expenditures

As of June 30, 2019, the total market value of the 79 endowment accounts established under the Endowment Matching Program was \$36,909,862 (Table 7). Of that amount, \$14,211,209 (or 38.50 percent) was state funds and \$22,698,653 (or 61.5 percent) was gift funds, interest income and market growth or loss. Foundation records show an outstanding balance of \$60,028 in unpaid pledges on these accounts. As of June 30, 2019, \$1,461,442 was expended for program activities during the fiscal year.
