Purpose of the CEBS Student Ambassadors

The College of Education and Behavioral Sciences (CEBS) Student Ambassadors serve as public relations and promotional representatives for all academic programs offered by the College of Education & Behavioral Sciences at Western Kentucky University. They are expected to represent the College and the University in a professional, positive, and responsible manner. The Student Ambassadors support the College of Education and Behavioral Sciences' vision as "leaders in scholarship and innovation" and its mission of "empowering individuals to lead and serve our dynamic world".

Roles of CEBS Professional Student Ambassador

- Represent the College of Education & Behavioral Sciences at recruitment events
- Assist with WKU TOP (Topper Orientation Program) for incoming freshmen
- Serve as hosts to visitors and guests of the WKU College of Education & Behavioral Sciences
- Conduct tours of campus and Gary A. Ransdell Hall
- Help at various CEBS related programs and events
- Serve as a student representative on CEBS committees

Benefits of Becoming a CEBS Professional Student Ambassador

- Build leadership and networking skills
- \$250 annual scholarship, if serving both semesters
- Earn graduation cords

Requirements of CEBS Student Ambassadors

- Have a GPA of 2.75 or above
- Have a declared major that is housed within the College of Education & Behavioral Sciences
- Be of at least sophomore standing and have taken at least six credit hours within your major
- Attend all CEBS Student Ambassador meetings
- Participate in at least 5 events per semester or as needed

Application Process

- Complete the attached application
- Attach a letter of recommendation from a CEBS faculty or staff member
- Return all application materials (application and letter of recommendation) to Jessica Basham in Gary Ransdell Hall room 2040 (within the Office of the Dean) or by emailing jessica.basham@wku.edu.
- If selected for the 2nd phase of the selection process, you must attend an interview.
