The focus of this concentration is to equip graduates to compete for internships accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Dietetics Education of the American Dietetic Association that lead to the "Registered Dietitian" designation. Graduates will emerge from this program with information and management skills which enable them to be creative problem solvers in the delivery of dietetic services.

### Career Opportunities in Nutrition and Dietetics:

Examples of careers for the graduate of this program are: dietitian in hospitals or schools; clinical dietitian; consultant to physician; community healthcare giver; commercial food service consultant; manager of food and/or dietetic services delivery system; researcher; writer; educational leader; clinical management consultant; or dietitian in wellness program.

### Bachelor of Science, Nutrition and Dietetics Concentration, Hospitality Management and Dietetics:

The Hospitality Management and Dietetics major (Ref. #707), Nutrition and Dietetics concentration (CFND) consists of 67 hours in Nutrition and Dietetics content courses, 44 hours of general education, plus other supportive courses to total 122 credit hours.
