The program can be completed in 4 years if the student completes all prerequisite courses, is admitted to the nursing program in the junior year and successfully completes all nursing courses in sequence.

Admission to the nursing program is limited and based on selection of the most qualified applicants who meet all admission requirements. The program can be completed in 4 years if the student completes all prerequisite courses, is admitted to the nursing program in the junior year and successfully completes all nursing courses in sequence.

Guaranteed Early Admission (GEA) to the WKU BSN program is available to first –time, full time college freshman and is not available for transfer students. This is a competitive application process and not all eligible students will be granted a GEA. The GEA application deadline is April 1st for students seeking Fall admission to WKU and September 1st for Spring admission. Prior to completing the GEA application you must apply for admission to WKU, submit your ACT scores and obtain a WKU ID number. See http://www.wku.edu/atwku/admissions.php for details.

Students seeking the GEA must have an ACT score of 23 or above. In addition, all students seeking entry into nursing must be able to meet all nursing admission requirements. Please see the School of Nursing website for complete details. If you are awarded a GEA, you must maintain a 3.0 GPA while in the pre-nursing program. GEA students must also obtain a grade of "B" or above in the following courses: Chem 109, Biol 131, Biol 231, Bio 207, Bio 208 and NURS 102. All general education courses and nursing required pre-requisite courses must be completed prior to entering the nursing program.

GEA students who maintain the above standards will be guaranteed admission to the WKU BSN program in either the fall or the spring semester of their Junior year. If you are not able to enroll in the BSN program during your Junior year for any reason, you will forfeit the GEA status and you must reapply to the nursing program with the general applicant pool to compete for a space in the BSN program.
