War in Kentucky

Bowling Green

Black and white and colored print of town viewed from the north side of the Barren River. From Harper's Weekly, March 15, 1862.

Black and white print of town following evacuation by the Confederates and occupation by Federal troops. Shows Baker Hill, College Hill and Webb Hill with forts. From Frank Leslie Illustrated, March 15, 1862.

Black and white print of the public square, courthouse and market house of the town. From Frank Leslie Illustrated, March 15, 1862.

Camps

Black and white or colored print of Camp John Holt, Kentucky.

Black and white print of Camp Holt, Kentucky, opposite Cairo, Illinois. From Harper's Weekly, January 25, 1862.

Colored print of Camp Nevin, Kentucky and General McCook's headquarters.

Black and white print of camp of Fourth Kentucky Regiment, near Somerset, Kentucky. From Harper's Weekly, March 1, 1862.

Black and white print of Camp Dick Robinson, Garrard County, Kentucky, the Great Rendezvous of Union troops and refuge of Tennessee exiles – recently deserted by General Bragg. From Harper's Weekly, November 1, 1862.

Black and white print of Camp Bruce, near Cynthiana, and the presentation of a flag to a Kentucky Volunteer Regiment. From Harper's Weekly, October 5, 1861.

Columbus, Kentucky

Black and white print of general view of town with its fortifications, looking down onto the river, along Iron Bluff with its batteries. Also other views of town and its

fortifications, including one showing the chain used by the Confederates to block the river, are available. From Frank Leslie Illustrated, March 22, 1862.
