Soon after receiving his PhD. in Creative Writing, and starting his career as a college professor, he **published his first novel**, *The Condemned*, in 2008. More than anything else, Dr. Bell says that he felt relieved, because his biggest fear was that he would die without ever having published a book. When his first novel was published, he says he began to think, "Wow. I should drive carefully, because I have something to live for." His wit is definitely another of Dr. Bell's shining attributes, as others could attest. Dr. LeNoir says, "He entertains and informs, and he connects with an audience in ways that other authors rarely succeed in doing."

Outside of the world of academia and writing, Dr. Bell has his other enjoyments as well.
