### Changing Your Major

Like what you saw at last week's Majors and Minors Fair? If you are still unsure of what your major should be, there is still time to decide. However, if you have made a decision and are ready to declare a major, here's how to make the next step happen:

1. Talk to your current advisor or an advisor for the new major you have selected. We want to make sure you know everything you need to about your decision. Your new major may require a minor or a concentration.
2. Login to TopNet.
3. Click on the tab at the top that says "Student Services."
4. Under this tab, click on "Student Records."
5. Choose the option that says "Change major, minor, concentration, advisor."
6. From the drop-down menu, select your new major, which will most likely say "Seeking Admission." You may also select a minor or concentration at this time.
7. There is another drop down menu for changing your advisor. Your advisor will change any-

way if you are no longer an Exploratory student, so go ahead and change it at this time.

8. Submit the information.
9. Confirm the change.
10. Print out the form. You will need a signature from your new major's department head, then it will need to be returned to the Academic Advising & Retention Center (AARC) for processing.
