

EDUCATION EMPHASIS

While not providing students with certification to teach this emphasis draws from education-related disciplines to allow students to take the topic-specific courses that will help them obtain their career objectives. Students might work with pre-school aged children or with after-school programs and agencies, as well as certain social service agencies that serve children.
