Specialty Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner courses will meet online synchronous via Blackboard (Bb) Collaborate five (5) weekday evenings and two (2) Saturday mornings a semester along with (OL) coursework via Bb. NURS 524 requires 160 clinical hours with adults 25 years or older: 60 hours with therapist(s) & 100 hours with prescribing provider(s). NURS 526 requires 160 clinical hours with children, adolescents, and young adults 24 years or younger: 60 hours with therapist(s) & 100 hours with prescribing provider(s). NURS 527 requires 350 clinical hours with patients across the lifespan: 100 hours with therapist(s) & 250 hours with prescribing provider(s). Therapist is defined as licensed therapist (e.g., LCSW, LMFT, LCT, etc.) or psychologist. Prescribing provider is defined as PMHNP or psychiatrist.

Evidence of completion of courses in Advanced Pathophysiology, Advanced Pharmacology, and an Advanced Health Assessment course with a clinical component are required as prerequisites. These courses may also be completed at WKU (course number and name below):
