### **APPENDIX B**

#### From Scott Gordon:

Here is the final graduate enrollment management report for Fall 2019. As of census, enrollment was 2275, which is -151 compared to Fall 2018.

Several factor contributed to this enrollment decrease. Drops in resident enrollment (-180), along with smaller declines in foreign (-21) and nonresident (-19) students, were not offset by an increase in military enrollment (+65), while other classification were flat. Within the resident population, the Kentucky counties showing the greatest change were Warren (-80), Hardin (-24), Fayette (-22), Barren (-11), Daviess (-11), Madison (-11), with Jefferson (+13) as the only county with a double-digit increase. The decrease in foreign student enrollment (-21) was less than the last two years (2016 to 2017, -98; 2017 to 2018, -88).

From a degree-level perspective, the largest decrease was in master's enrollment (-187), while the largest increase was in non-degree enrollment (+60; the non-degree increase is largely due to a special project where Jefferson County Public School educators are taking a series of online courses, and some of these students may enroll in a degree-seeking program in a future term). Each academic college had fewer enrolled students (declines ranged from -39 to -23). Enrollment dropped for both part-time (-92) and full-time (-59) students.
