Chemistry 222 is the second lecture course in the Chemistry 120-223 sequence. It is designed for students majoring in the sciences or science intensive areas. ***A final grade of a "C" or better in Chemistry 120 and Math 118 (or equivalent) are the prerequisites for this course. In addition, Chemistry 222 must be accompanied by Chemistry 223 laboratory.***

Your grade for this course will be determined from your performance on four hour exams given during the normal class period, quizzes (as needed) and the final exam. No written papers are required and no special assignments for extra credit will be assigned. The percent values used to determine exam and course grades are generally: A \$ 85%; B \$ 75%; C \$ 65%, etc.
