Writing Outcomes for Assessment

What's the difference between Learning Outcomes and Outcomes for Student Success? Learning Outcomes are what students will take from a specific class or academic program. Outcomes for Student Success can sometimes look like learning outcomes but can also relate to other types of success that are more experiential.

Students will improve skills related to exposure to center experiences.

Students will gain real world experience through internships.

Students will gain awareness of mental health issues.

Students will make progress towards their degree.

Students will be engaged in a campus experience.
