Memorandum of Understanding **Articulation Agreement** Between

Western Kentucky University, Bachelor of Social Work And

Kentucky Community & Technical College System, Associate in Applied Science in Human Services

I. **PURPOSE**

This Agreement between Western Kentucky University (WKU) and Kentucky Community & Technical College System (KCTCS) seeks to create a high-quality, mutually beneficial partnership that promotes the transfer of credits between two institutions and thereby increases education opportunities for students of KCTCS. The goal of this Agreement is to outline an articulation process whereby KCTCS Associate in Applied Science (AAS) Human Sciences graduates may apply earned credit toward the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree offered by the Department of Social Work in the College of Health and Human Services at WKU.

This articulation agreement stipulates a course of study whereby a KCTCS AAS in Human Services graduate may transfer a block of courses, including the required prerequisites for the BSW, into WKU to meet the requirements for the Bachelor of Social Work degree at WKU.

II. **ACCREDITATION STATUS**

Both institutions will observe the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC), the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE), and Council on Social Work Education guidelines and procedures and will adhere to the requirements of reporting information to these and other accrediting agencies.

III. ELEMENTS OF THE AGREEMENT

- A. Admissions Practices: Applicants for the WKU Bachelor of Social Work in are selected based upon the following criteria:
 - 1. All transfer students must request that an official transcript from each college attended be sent to the WKU Admissions Office, 1906 College Heights Blvd. #11020, Bowling Green, KY 42101-1020, or preferable electronically, or call (270)745-2551 if you have questions.
 - 2. Admission to WKU: http://www.wku.edu/atwku/admissions.php
 - 3. Sophomore status.
 - 4. Overall 2.5 grade point average (GPA).
 - 5. Formal application to the WKU BSW Program, including application, essay, NASW Code of Ethics Agreement Statement, WKU BSW Student Handbook Agreement Statement, and screening interview with the BSW Program Director. Note: * The expectation is that HMS 101 /SWK 222 and HMS102/SWK 124 are taught by faculty who possess the MSW degree from an institution accredited by the Council on Social Work Education. If that is not the case, the WKU BSW program reserves the right to review the syllabi for these courses and the credentials of the faculty teaching them. These courses may have to be repeated at WKU.

- 7. Of the courses completed in the AAS in Human Services, if nine of the credit hours are HMS 103 or higher, or SWK 180 or higher, then additional electives will not be rquir3ed for the BSW at WKU.
- 8. If the Social Work major has not been declared, students may complete a change of major/minor form on Topnet and talk with the Social Work office regarding an advisor assignment (270-745-5312).

B. Application of Credits

- 1. Students successfully completing the required prerequisites and steps for admission to the WKU BSW program will enter WKU as fully admitted BSW majors. The expectation is that the BSW degree can be completed in a minimum of five semester once the student matriculates to WKU.
- 2. KCTCS students transfer 64 or more credit hours into the BSW in Social Work as outlined in the following tables (34 from the AAS in Human Services, and 30 or more general education courses). The 42 upper level credit hours (39 of Social Work and 3 of upper division electives), can be completed on the Bowling Green, Elizabethtown, Owensboro, or Glasgow campuses of WKU. A total of 120 credit hours are required for the Bachelor degree from WKU.
- 3. Students are encouraged to arrive from KCTCS fully-certified in General Education. If not, the transfer student in the BSW program must complete the WKU Colonnade General Education requirements and comply with all published Academic Requirements and Regulations (see WKU Undergraduate Catalog for details). KCTCS students with an AA or AS are designated as fully-certified in General

- Education and have completed the WKU Colonnade General Education requirements.
- 4. The AAS in Human Services from KCTCS requires a Quantitative Reasoning (QR) and Natural Sciences (NS) course, yet a specific course is not recommended. The below courses count toward the AAS, but also satisfy several admission requirements for the BSW program at WKU. Recommendations to complete during the AAS:

5. To complete the Kentucky General Education Requirement and become fully-certified, two options are available: 1) complete at KCTCS while working on the AAS; or 2) complete at WKU. Below are course suggestions for each option:

Option 1: Complete General Education at KCTCS. It is important to note that several Admission requirements for the BSW program at WKU overlap with the KCTCS Associate of Arts (AA) degree requirements and thus are beneficial to complete.
