

SOCIAL WORK, B.S.W transfer plan

Western Kentucky University

Purpose: To promote transfer of credits from the A.A.S. in Human Services from KCTCS into the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) for WKU

Accreditation Statues: Both institutions will observe the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC), the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE), and Council on Social Work Education guidelines and procedures.

Admissions of Practices: Applicants for the Western Kentucky University's BSW program are selected based upon the following criteria:

- 1. All transfer students must request that an official transcript from <u>each</u> college attended be sent to the WKU Admissions Office, 1906 College Heights Blvd. #11020, Bowling Green, KY 42101-1020, or preferable electronically, or call (270)745-2551 if you have questions.
- 2. Admission to WKU.
- 3. A 2.5 overall GPA required for admission to the WKU BSW program.
- 4. A separate application for admission into the BSW program is required by the designed deadline. Application materials can be found at the WKU Department of Social Work's website: http://www.wku.edu/socialwork
- 5. Completion of the BSW prerequisite coursework:

Note: * The expectation is that HMS 101 and 102 are taught by faculty possessing the MSW degree from an institution accredited by the Council on Social Work Education. If that is not the case, the WKU BSW program reserves the right to review the syllabi for these courses and the credentials of the faculty teaching them. These courses may have to be repeated at WKU.

Application of Credits:

- Transfer equivalencies for WKU admitted students are available on iCAP: http://www.wku.edu/icap/. If not formally admitted to WKU, course transfer equivalencies are available: http://www.wku.edu/transferequivalencies.
- 2. Students successfully completing the required prerequisites and steps for admission to the WKU BSW Program will enter WKU as fully admitted BSW majors. The expectation is that the BSW degree can be completed in a minimum of five semesters once the student matriculates to WKU.

- 3. Students must comply with all WKU Academic Requirements and Regulations (as published in the undergraduate catalog). A Baccalaureate degree from WKU requires a minimum of 120 credit hours.
- 4. This agreement allows KCTCS graduates to transfer 64 or more credit hours into the BSW in Social Work as outlined in the attached table (34 from the AAS in Human Services, and 30 or more general education courses). The 42 upper level credit hours (39 of Social Work and 3 of upper division electives), can be completed on the Bowling Green, Elizabethtown, Owensboro, or Glasgow campus of WKU.
- 5. Students may arrive from KCTCS fully-certified in General Education or complete WKU's General Education requirements. KCTCS students with an AA or AS are designated as fully-certified in General Education and will be credited as meeting WKU's General Education requirements. Student with an AAS degree may stay at KCTCS in order to become General Education certified. The AAS in Human Services from KCTCS requires a Quantitative Reasoning (QR) and Natural Sciences (NS) course, yet a specific course is not recommended. The below courses count toward the AAS, but also satisfy several admission requirements for the BSW program at WKU. Recommendations to complete during the AAS:

6. To complete the state General Education Requirement and become fully-certified, two options are available: 1) complete at KCTCS while working on the AAS; or 2) complete at WKU. Below are course suggestions for each option:

Option 1: Complete General Education at KCTCS. It is important to note that several Admission requirements for the BSW program at WKU overlap with the KCTCS Associate of Arts (AA) degree requirements and thus are beneficial to complete.

Option 2: Complete General Education at WKU. The below assumes the above recommendations in QR and NS are completed, as well as, Heritage and BSW Admission Requirements during the AAS or AA:

- 7. Students transferring into WKU from KCTCS for the program are required to complete a minimum of 42 upper division hours to earn a WKU degree, of which 39 are imbedded in the BSW major.
