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Program Summary (Briefly summarize the action and follow up items from your detailed responses on subsequent pages.)

All BSN program goals for student learning outcomes are currently being met. Outcomes are monitored each year on a schedule set by the program evaluation committee and report the results from the previous year at the School of Nursing and Allied Health start up meeting in August of each year. However, we will continue to monitor the goals and make corrections as needed. As our cohort sizes have greatly increased which has increased the student/faculty ratio, we will likely see a decrease in student learning outcomes due to the decreased selectivity for admissions and the decreased ability for faculty to work individually with students. This has not happened yet, but we are just starting to graduate students from the larger (120) cohorts as of 2019. We will report the results from these students on next year's report.

Methods	As this is a required nationally normed exam, all student data is included, not a random sample. This is a Pass/Fail exam, no individual student scores are reported. For 2018, 129 BSN students took the NCLEX-RN, 128 passed for a 99% first time pass rate. The National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) reviews and approves the NCLEX-RN test plan every 3 years. Their website (https://www.ncsbn.org/2019_RN_TestPlan-English.pdf) provides the following information regarding the NCLEX-RN. The exam is organized into four major client needs categories which includes: Safe and effective care environment, health promotion and maintenance, psychosocial integrity, and physiological integrity. The exam is designed to measure critical thinking abilities and is further divided into subcategories: Management of care, safety and infection control, basic care and comfort, pharmacological and parenteral therapies, reduction of risk potential and physiological adaptation. Integrated processes measured include the nursing process, caring, communication and documentation, teaching/learning, and culture and spirituality.

We will continue to monitor and work to maintain our excellent NCLEX-RN outcomes. For example, the Academic Standards committee recommended that the Exam Security Workforce ad hoc committee to establish continuity in BSN examinations test item delivery to mimic NCLEX-RN. One request when using Blackboard for exam delivery is to set “test options” where test items are presented “one at a time” and “prohibit backtracking.” Other exam delivery methods are being explored for these options, as needed. This recommendation was sent to the BSN Faculty committee for review and approval.

During the 2019-2020 AY the BSN curriculum, Academic Standards committee will monitor implementation of the above changes and report outcomes to the Program Evaluation Committee.

Methods	<p>Direct: Students will compile a collection of selected coursework into an electronic Senior Portfolio as part of the N403 Nursing Leadership, Management, and Professional Issues course in the final semester of the BSN Program. The selected coursework consists of: Policy Paper (N422 Senior Practicum), Self-Narrative of BSN Program Outcomes, Philosophy of Nursing Statement, Cover letter and Resume, Legislative letter (N449 Community Health Nursing), and a 3rd Semester Group Project. Students must earn a 77% on the Senior Portfolio in order to pass the N403 course.</p> <p>Indirect:</p>

Methods	100% of employer surveys returned and 100% of employer comments obtained during focus group sessions from the last year will be used as the sample. Aggregate data from employer surveys will demonstrate a minimum of 70% agreement in all areas. Areas with less than 70% agreement will be reviewed by the program evaluation committee and actions noted as needed. From advisory committee focus groups, 15 respondents indicated “Excellent” one indicated “good” academic standards. This was the same for professional preparation and likelihood would recommend WKU. From the employer surveys, no areas on Fall ’18 or Spring ’19 feedback indicated more than 30% disagreement with any item.

Methods	100% of students who graduate from the BSN program will be used as the sample. A minimum of 70% of graduating WKU BSN students will report an accepted job offer as a RN applicant during their senior leadership class, and report the name of the		

	health care agency making the job offer. Students may receive multiple offers, but the one they accept is the one recorded. For Fall 2018, 67 students graduated, 65 of these students had accepted positions, 2 were undecided, 1 did not report any post-graduate employment plans. For Spring 2019, 88 students graduated, 75 had accepted positions, 4 reported undecided, 1 was planning to be a stay at home mom and 8 did not report any post-graduation employment plans. Total graduating 18-19 was 155, total reporting accepting employment offers by the time of graduation 140 = 90%.

Each semester had no areas greater than 30% disagree. One local employer changed their dress code and noted student dress code issues. One employer provided a recommendation for the BSN program to include more charting experiences. This has been referred to the appropriate course faculty.

The prelicensure committee revised the BSN dress code this AY to stay current with local area dress code for their employees. An electronic charting system is incorporated into the nursing learning lab.

Methods	All graduating students in the BSN program take the HESI Exit exam during their last semester, obtain a score with feedback on their strengths and weaknesses, obtain remediation in all areas of weakness and take a second version of the exam to determine if they have improved. Scores from the first attempt are used for this outcome measure and are compared with national data from other BSN programs. The HESI Exit exam is a standardized exam that contains critical thinking test items and evaluate a student's ability to apply content and concepts to clinical problems. The category groups include: Assessment, analysis, planning, implementation, evaluation, safe/effective environment, management of care, safety and infection control, health promotion and maintenance, and psychosocial integrity.

The specialty area and topic for these lowered scoring items have been referred back to the course coordinators for the appropriate classes as areas for improvement. We will continue to monitor all items which drop below the national average. Plan for curriculum mapping. The curriculum committee plans to review the current NCLEX-RN blueprint along with the HESI Exit 2 topics to identify any gaps or weaknesses in content within the program.</p>

1. Entire document: (2 points each, 6 points possible)
 - 1.1. Criteria 1. *Strictly adheres to template and rubric, appears professional in appearance:* Removes place holders, no yellow highlights, etc. 1” margins (top, bottom, left, right); typed in Times New Roman, 12-point font; & double spaced. (2 points)
 - 1.2. Criteria 2. BSN program documents submitted in their original graded format (for example: APA formatting must be retained). (2 points)
 - 1.3. Criteria 3. Order of documents must follow the order as stated in the Table of Contents. All required documents combined/compiled sequentially. Saved and submitted as one pdf file via Blackboard. (2 points)
2. Title page – follows template (2 points each, 6 points possible)
 - 2.1. Criteria 1. Title in upper ½ of page, upper and lower case. (2 points)
 - 2.2. Criteria 2. Student first name, middle initial, and last name, title of school, semester, year. (2 points)
 - 2.3. Criteria 3. Just above the one inch bottom margin, center between left and right margins: Completed in partial fulfillment of requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing. (2 points)
3. Table of Contents – follows template (2 points each, 4 points possible)
 - 3.1. Criteria 1. All documents listed in sequential order. (2 points)
 - 3.2. Criteria 2. No page numbers. (2 points)
4. Introduction – follows template (9 points possible);
 - 4.1. Criteria 1. Written in first-person. (2 points)
