The Global Health Administration certificate program aims to support the university mission of preparing graduates who can apply their learned skills and knowledge to making contributions and solving problems with global perspectives. SLO #2 intends to foster the global aspect of the program by promoting student participation in health administration activities in abroad settings, where students could attain first-hand experiences in understanding how international health systems work. The program alone might not achieve this

goal without strong partnerships among entities supporting international education within the university. Plans are underway to seek potential collaborations to increase awareness and participation in global learning.
 The program assigns students to local activities/agencies that offer global perspectives in health administration if students have to complete the entire certificate program domestically.

Measurement Instrument 1	Direct measure of student learning: Students need to have a mastery understanding of how health systems are structured and what primary processes are involved to be able to assess administration and management of the same. HCA 547 is a core course in the program that offers the student the opportunity to learn and acquire knowledge on the factors of evolution of the health systems. The term paper prompts the students to provide their analytical assessments on the system values and allows them to demonstrate appropriate comparisons across nations and regions of the world.
