The department is pleased we achieved our target for the fall 2018 semester. The number of JPR participants dipped below 50% in the spring of 2019, however. This was not unexpected. The number participants each semester varies according to enrollment, cohort size, and progress through the degree. The spring semester JPR figure reflects a smaller than average senior cohort, and a larger than average sophomore cohort who were not required to participate in JPR. The department will continue to monitor these numbers and address issues of participation and student progress, should a trend emerge.

While the department feels the JPR process is a vitally important aspect of the program, the Theatre & Dance department faculty have decided to substantially rework our Student Learning Outcomes and instruments going forward.
