Outcome 1: Students will demonstrate an acquaintance with a wide selection of theatre repertory including the principal eras, genres, and cultural sources.

• Instrument: Students will bring a list of performances they've seen and participated in during their time at WKU to their 6th semester jury. The primary instrument for measuring achievement will be based on the number of eras, genres, and cultural sources represented on their list, as compared to a master list of categories prepared by the department. Students ability to correctly identify the genres, eras, and cultural sources of a certain number of the productions they have listed during a conversation with faculty will serve as a secondary measurement.

Outcome 2: Students will demonstrate the ability to develop and defend informed judgments about theatre.

• Instrument: Discussion of a performance they saw or participated in in the 6th semester jury. As part of a discussion with faculty, students will be expected to state their evaluation of one or more aspects of a performance they attended or participated in. Their evaluation should be: supported by specific evidence/examples which are appropriately analyzed; understood in relation to knowledge of theatre as a whole; placed in context of the production circumstances. Faculty will use a rubric to score the student's ability to do.

Outcome 3. Demonstrate meaningfully participation in at least three different aspects of theatrical production

• Instrument: Faculty review of anonymized student Resumes and Student Production Resumes.

They may also optionally participate in their 5th semester. At each JPR they are asked to bring several artifacts documenting their progress in the program, including a student production resume, professional resume, and sample materials. JPR objectives, process and alignment with accreditation standards of the National Association of Schools of Theatre are explained in the attached BA Theatre & Dance Student Handbook.
