| Due to the COVID-19 modifications in Spring 2020 (which is when the majority of program assessments occur), we were not able to conduct all the assessments planned and indicated above. We did, however, conduct assessments for each SLO sufficiently to determine the results above. We had originally planned for externally conducted Oral proficiency interviews (OPI) to be SLO 1, Instrument 1, but this was not possible do to proctoring requirements. Therefore, the number of oral exams in the 300-400 level courses was doubled due to the change in delivery modes and SLO 1, Instrument 1 changed. Also, the Test of Arabic Culture Knowledge, a written test, was not conducted, but additional oral exams were conducted in ARBC 438 and ARBC 357 and additional oral presentations required that dealt with cultural topics. Despite the modifications, we are confident that all outcomes were achieved. | | | | | | |

These reading comprehension exercises use authentic materials at the intermediate level (news excerpts). Students are required to answer short answer questions that test comprehension at the factual (not interpretive or abstract) level. The questions are designed to assess student understanding of specific words and phrases in their context and are thus at the intermediate level. | | | | |

| The results for all instruments are consistent with past results, although a bit lower (with the exception of Instrument 1, which is slightly below the goal). Due to the changes brought about by COVID-19, with all classes moving to Zoom, the quality of speaking and listening practice was degraded. While usable for interpersonal speaking, Zoom for a large class that depends on small group speaking activities is not. This, combined with the stresses put on students to support families during the virus, we believe accounted for part of the decline. The return to in –person class in Fall 2020 will improve this situation. | | | | | |
