

Research Internship Grant 2020

Deadline to Apply: Friday, March 13

Application must be typed, signed, and submitted electronically.

About: The Gatton Academy of Mathematics and Science in Kentucky created the Gatton Research Internship Grant program in 2010. Made possible by a gift from Mr. Carol Martin “Bill” Gatton, the program offers grants to Gatton Academy students between their junior and senior years to support summer research internships at WKU, across the Commonwealth, the USA, and the world. By providing funding, the program directly creates research internships that otherwise would not have existed for Gatton Academy students. Past students have used their internships as a springboard to later apply for prestigious awards such as the Siemens Competition, the Intel Science Talent Search, and the Goldwater Scholarship. Many recipients submit their work for peer-reviewed publication and for conference presentations.

Application Components:

- **Part I-** Student/Proposal Information
- **Part II-** Student Essay
- **Part III-** Signed Parental Consent Form
- **Part IV-** Statement from Supervising Mentor form plus a Letter of Support (LOS) from the Mentor. The LOS should contain the following:
 - The name and a short description of the research
 - The student’s role in the research
 - The specific dates and daily hours the student will be working
- **Part V (optional for students)-** Application for up to \$1,200 Gatton Research Internship Summer Housing Assistance Grant*
- **Part VI (optional for WKU Mentors)-** Application for up to \$500 Gatton Research Internship Supplies Grant**

*only available to students who require housing at their internship site that requires a rental fee.

**only available to mentors who are full-time Western Kentucky University faculty.

How to Submit: All application components should be electronically submitted to Cheryl Kirby-Stokes at cheryl.kirby-stokes@wku.edu by **Friday, March 13, 2020**.

Eligibility:

- Be a student in the Class of 2021, eligible at the spring semester’s end for fall 2020 return;
- Be proposing original, mentored research in a STEM discipline for summer 2020;
- Propose a specific research project (including location, date ranges, and description of research objectives) and complete all components of the application;
- Find a STEM professional—with content expertise—who agrees to mentor and supervise the summer research/internship at the hosting location;
- Submit all application components electronically by the **deadline of Friday, March 13, 2020**.

Expectations:

Recipients of awards will be required to:

- Enroll in a 1-hour internship course at WKU. Tuition for this course (\$450) will come out of the grant;
- Fulfill all terms of the research/internship experience as set forth in the proposal;
- Receive a grade upon the completion of the experience based off of the evaluation found on the school webpage;
- Write an original Research Report to fit competition standards (feedback and support is provided);
- Submit their research to the Regeneron competition or to another equally-rigorous science competition at the end of the RIG period;
- Use the internship experience and written report to submit to conferences, peer-reviewed journals, and other relevant programs and/or competitions.

Guidelines/Rules/Advice

- Eight-week, full-time internships are the minimum considered for a *full* grant. Full grants are up to \$2,000. Optional housing assistance (up to \$1,200) and research supplies (up to \$500) are also available;
- Research hours are limited to 40 hrs/week at all times;

- Budget time in your proposal to work on writing your research report;
- Placements can be in any STEM discipline, anywhere where an applicant finds a STEM professional who will oversee their research--universities, governmental laboratories, and STEM industries are all acceptable. Think big. Both quality and creativity of proposals are important;
- Applications should detail where students will live, eat, and how they will get around to illustrate planning;
- If an applicant is accepted to an internship program that is paid (travel, housing, meals, stipend, etc.), the student is considered ineligible for the award.
- Monetary employment of any kind during the RIG research period stipulated in the RIG application must be approved by the Sponsoring Mentor and Cheryl Kirby-Stokes.
- Any changes to working dates or hours in the RIG proposal must be discussed with the Sponsoring Mentor and Cheryl Kirby-Stokes to receive approval.

Instructions: Please attach a typed proposal. Please limit your response so that both parts one and two fit onto two, double-spaced pages.

Part One: Describe the research project you are proposing and your research objectives (think realistic for a summer and have these approved by the scientist who will oversee you). At the very least, address the following questions: What is the big-picture problem/question you will research? What contribution do you hope to make to the problem/question this summer? What research goals do you have? What will you do while “on-the-job” each day? What are your personal goals in wanting to complete this project?

Part Two: Describe the logistical details of how you’re going to survive a highly-independent summer. Where will you live while you work on your research/internship and who will you live with? Where will you eat? How will you get to the location of your research/internship on a daily basis? Fill your essay with details of your proposed experience. A timeline table or chart is recommended (i.e. *Week 1 I will ____ and Week 2 I will ____*).

Instructions to Supervising Mentor:

- Complete the Application Part IV—Statement from a Supervising Mentor form (next page);
- Attach a Letter of Support (LOS) explaining the project in which you are agreeing to host a Gatton Academy of Mathematics and Sciences student. The LOS should contain:
 - The name and a short description of the research
 - The student's role in the research
 - The dates and hours the student will be working
- Submit the form and Letter of Support electronically to Cheryl Kirby-Stokes at cheryl.kirby-stokes@wku.edu by **Friday, March 13, 2020**.
- Mentor responsibilities include:
 - Providing consistent mentorship, including regularly-scheduled progress meetings, throughout the RIG contract period;
 - Working with students one-on-one on the written research report;
 - Not turning mentorship of the student intern over to Graduate Assistants or others in the research lab;
 - At any time throughout the RIG contract period, reporting to The Gatton Academy concerns about the student intern's performance.

About the Research Internship Grant

Funded by a gift from Carol Martin "Bill" Gatton, the Gatton Academy's Research Internship Grant was founded in 2010. The program gives selected students from the Gatton Academy's current rising senior class the opportunity to receive summer research grants in amounts up to \$3,200. Awards are meant to defray the housing, meal, and transportation expenses associated with summer STEM research experiments and investigations. Through the program, students are mentored in designing and carrying out their own original research project. Students create a Research Report that can be entered into some of the nation's most prestigious high school-level STEM research competitions. Please note for your own consideration that because this award is limited to our Class of 2021, it is likely that the applicant you will work with will not yet be 18 during the Summer 2020.

Credit/Grading

Gatton Academy Research Internship Grant recipients will earn one college credit hour through Western Kentucky University for Honors: Independent Research (Honors 303). Students who do research at Western Kentucky University will be graded on a traditional grading scale. At the end of the summer, you will send the grade for the student you worked with that will go on their official high school and university transcripts to The Gatton Academy. The grade is based off of the following: 1) an evaluation of the student that you complete and return (50%), and 2) the student's completion of a research report, following guidelines from the Regeneron competition for high school STEM research, not to exceed 20 pages (50%). The complete grading criteria/rubric will be provided to all supervising scientists of Research Internship Grant recipients at the onset of the experience, but may also be viewed in advance at: <http://www.wku.edu/academy/academics/researchgrant/index.php>.

2019 Timeline

- Now – First week of March: Students discuss potential summer research internships with Mentors. NOTE: Students should be involved to the extent possible in the project's origin and design.
- March 13, 2020: Deadline for complete student applications
- April 5, 2020: Last possible date for selection notifications
- May 15, 2020 or later: Research Start Dates: Varies by student's arrangement with mentor
- June 15, 2020: Introduction and Lit Review Section of Research Report Due
- July 15, 2020: Materials and Methodology Section of Research Report Due



- August 15, 2020: Final Draft of Complete Research Report Due
- August 31, 2020: Research Mentor Reports Student Grade to The Gatton Academy

The Gatton Research Internship Summer Housing Assistance Grant provides up to \$1,200 awards to students who require such rental housing. This funding is limited to students who do not have the option to live with parents/guardians or a trusted relative or friend during their summer research period.

Note: Students completing their RIG on the campus of WKU are required to stay in on-campus housing if they apply for the Housing Assistance Grant.
