Peer Intrusive Advisors are vital in the dissemination of information to enhance the relationship between students and Western Kentucky University. Additionally, these para-professionals provide administrative support to the AARC professional staff.

If you are a detail oriented person who likes working in a fast paced environment, this could be the perfect position for you. Peer Intrusive Advisors work a set schedule between 15 and 20 hours a week.
