ADVERBS

An adverb, as in English, can modify a verb telling how, when, where, how often you did something. In English, we typically look for the ending "ly" to identify an adverb:

I walked slowly

He jumped suddenly

In Arabic, the ending \hat{I} has basically the same function. You can put it on an adjective or noun to make it an adverb:

صباح (morning)
$$\rightarrow$$
 صباحاً (morningly, i.e. "in the morning") 1

Additional useful adverbs include:

¹ Don't get hung up on the fact that some of these words don't exist in English. "Morningly" makes as much sense as "daily" or "nightly" even though we don't use it.

Some other familiar words are actually adverbs in Arabic, although their English equivalents are not:

عفواً- excuse me, you're welcome

غداً- tomorrow
