Definitions:

* Graduation Rate indicates the percentage of students in a cohort that graduated within six years of beginning their program.

* Number in Cohort indicates the total initial cohort size. For example, the Fall 2011 Cohort for Middle Level Education Social Studies/Language Arts began with 4 students. Two of those four (50%) had graduated within six years.

*First-Time, First-Year Student is a student attending the institution for the first time at the undergraduate level. Also includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior summer term, and students who entered with advanced standing (e.g., dual credit).
