CHHS Alumni renovate Old Governor's Mansion in Frankfort

Jason Hildabrand, a 2001 WKU graduate with a Bachelor's Degree in Interior

Design will be among the approximately two dozen decorators, painters, and electricians recruited by the Lexington-based L.V. Harkness & Company to restore the Old Governor's Mansion in Frankfort.

Hildabrand, now a local interior designer, was nominated and then chosen by Kentucky first lady Jane Beshear. He will be in charge of the lieutenant governor's study.

"I think it's pretty cool," he said. "I get to meet with the lieutenant governor one-on-one."

Hildabrand plans to honor the mansion's history by using vintage accessories, such as historic photographs, antique picture frames and original artworks.

"Everything tells a story. I think that's important," Hildabrand said. "Anybody can go to a furniture store and buy a print there's a thousand of."

He has received many inquiries from business owners who would also like to take part in the renovation.

"I've gotten a lot of feedback, and a lot of things donated that I didn't ask for," he said. "A lot of it was excitement of people wanting to be involved."

After having his house featured on HGTV in 2007, he opened his business, Hildabrand Interiors, and started designing full-time.

"No day is ever the same," he said. "The projects you do are always different."

WKU Students Study Facility Planning, Design, and Construction

WKU graduate students enrolled in REC 515, Recreation and Sport Facility Development spent the May term learning about planning, designing, and constructing recreation and sport facilities. The field-based course engages students while learning about facility design trends, construction terminology, the roles of planning and construction professionals, construction standards established by various governing and professional bodies (OSHA, ADA, AAHPERD, ACSM, USGBC), universal design and accessibility, facility risk management, and green design and sustainability initiatives.

Students interview facility managers and construction professionals while touring indoor and outdoor facilities. Students complete Facility Profiles and participate in online Discussions utilizing the course website. Students profile a facility of interest for their classmates and participate in a group project. The group project for this class involved planning a dedication for WKU's 140-acre Hardin F. McChesney Field Campus in northern Warren County. Students presented proposals related to road and dedication site construction, signage, security, and event logistics. Presentations were given to WKU administrators, faculty, staff, and other students near the end of the course. Nearly all student ideas will be implemented before and during the August 4th dedication ceremony at 10am at the site.

This course has been taught by Dr. Fred Gibson since 2002. Students have visited numerous sites over the years including Louisville Slugger Field, Sommet Center, Centennial Sportsplex Freedom Hall,

Churchill Downs, Nashville Super Speedway, Phil Moore Park, L.T. Smith Stadium, Stones River National Battlefield, Bowling Green Ballpark (Hotrods), The Club at Olde Stone, Maryland Farms YMCA, Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, Russell Sims Aquatic Center, Scottville YMCA, Louisville Extreme Sports Park, Mammoth Cave National Park, The Center for Courageous Kids, WKU Leadership and Experiential Education Center (LEEC), Kereiakes Park, Curb Music Center/Beaman Student Life Center at Belmont University, Bowling Green Athletic Club, Camp Loucon, Bowling Green Parks and Recreation Fitness Center, E.A. Diddle Arena, and Total Fitness Connection.
