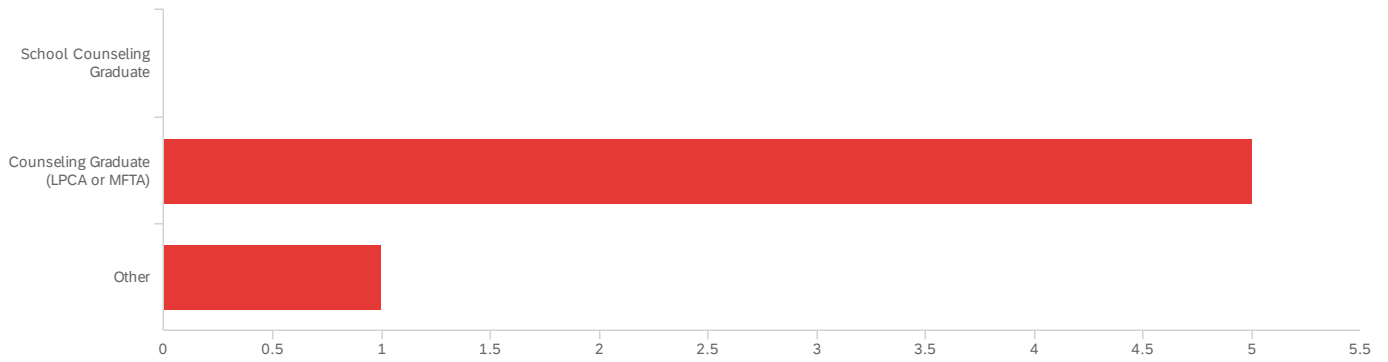

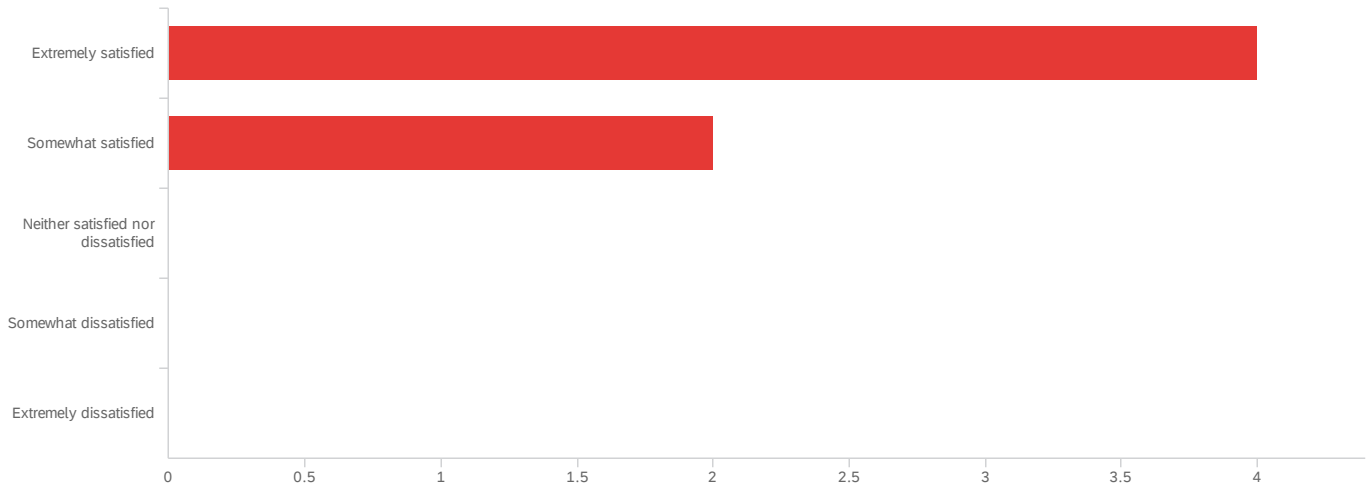

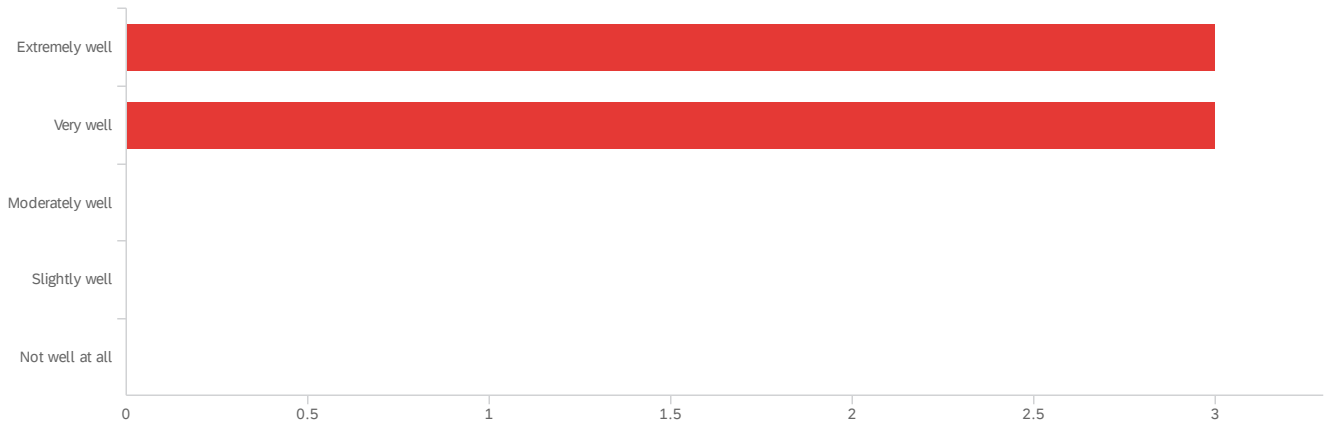
Q1 - How satisfied are you with the professional performance of WKU counseling interns and/or graduates?

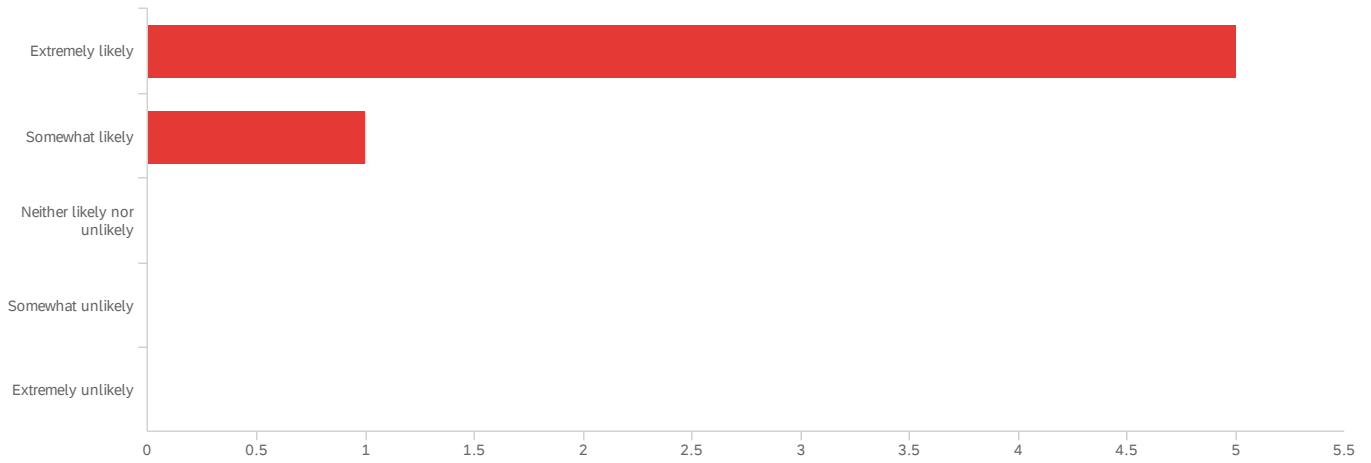
Q2 - How well do WKU counseling interns and/or graduates meet the expectations of your agency or school?

The instructors have high expectations of students. Mediocrity is not accepted at WKU. I know this because I am a graduate of WKU's counseling program. The program is very strong in terms of theoretical application of counseling.

I find that the interns from the counseling department come with more clinical knowledge than the other departments that I take interns from on occasion, such as social work. I have also experienced more professionalism from the counseling students in comparison.

Attending to and providing empathy for our patients at the clinic. Engaging in providing professional individual and group therapy services and ensuring clinical documentation is completed by end of work day.

WKU graduates typically are prepared to enter the field and supervision addresses growth, specialization rather than remediation.

Knowledge base of basic counseling skills, work ethic, sound understanding of the counseling field and ethics.

What improvements would you like to see regarding WKU counseling graduates...

I would like for the interns to understand the importance of bringing their counseling videos to supervision so that they can be viewed and discussed with the field supervisor. In the future, I will stress this importance and ask that students show me the video before it is viewed in class.

I would like for the program to teach more CBT and evidence based treatment approaches. The students I have worked with seem to get a good education on the treatment of trauma but often lack education on the treatment of other mental health disorders and conditions.

Having more availability with time at the clinic.

More developed understanding and skill of a specific theoretical orientation.

Interns could benefit from a greater understanding of more counseling theories.
