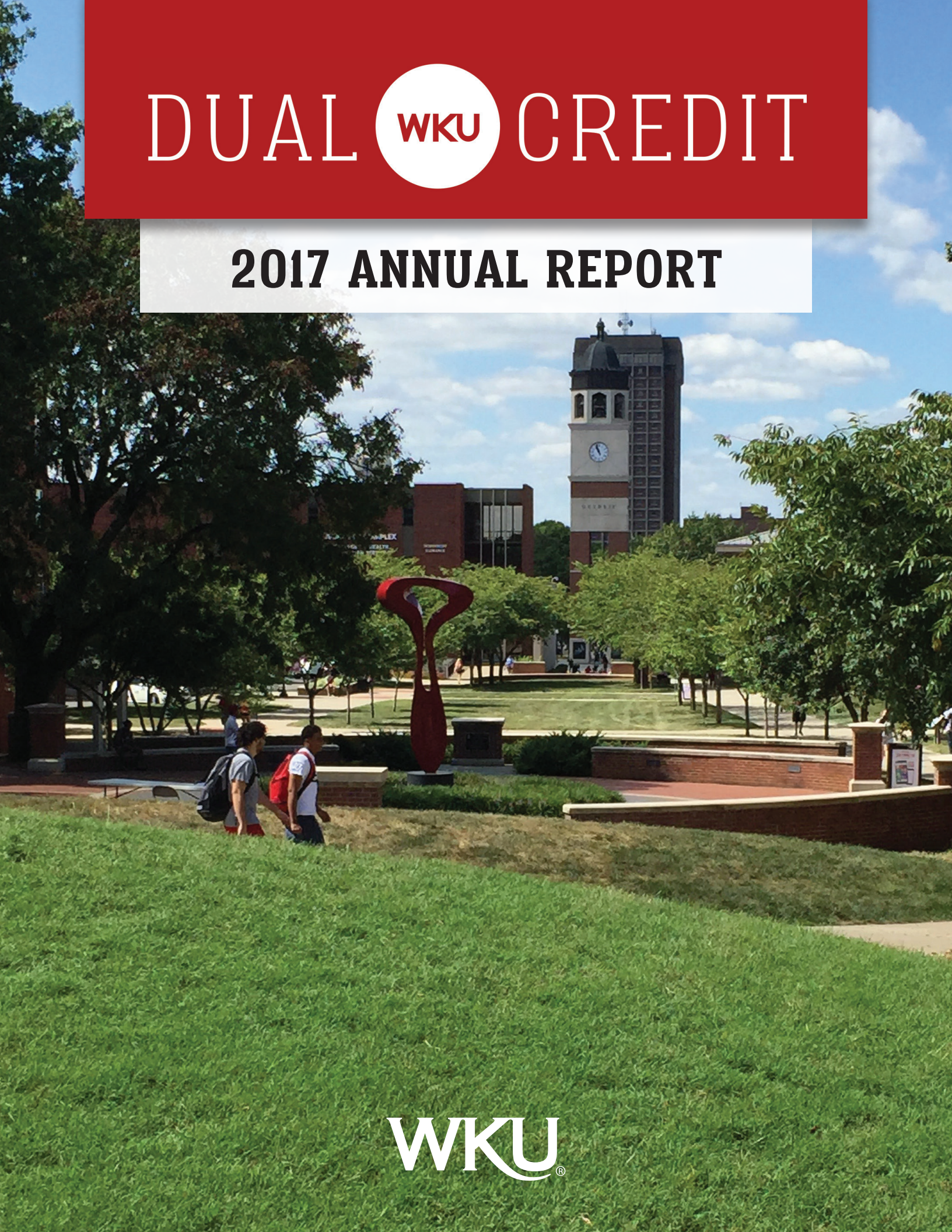

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ABOUT DUAL CREDIT

WKU Dual Credit

Dual Credit is a partnership between WKU's Division of Extended Learning & Outreach (DELO) and area high schools to offer qualified students the opportunity to earn college credit as part of their high school curriculum. Dual Credit courses are offered at the high school during regular school hours by WKU faculty or by high school teachers who meet all accreditation standards according to the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges.

Real College Credit?

Courses offered through WKU Dual Credit are "real" college classes. Students taking dual credit courses are registered and enrolled at WKU as "non-degree seeking students prior to high school graduation." The grades earned in dual credit courses are the first college grades students receive. Whether they decide to attend WKU or another institution after high school, grades earned in dual credit courses are a permanent part of students' academic record. Please note that participation in Dual Credit does not guarantee admission to WKU as a "degree seeking freshman."

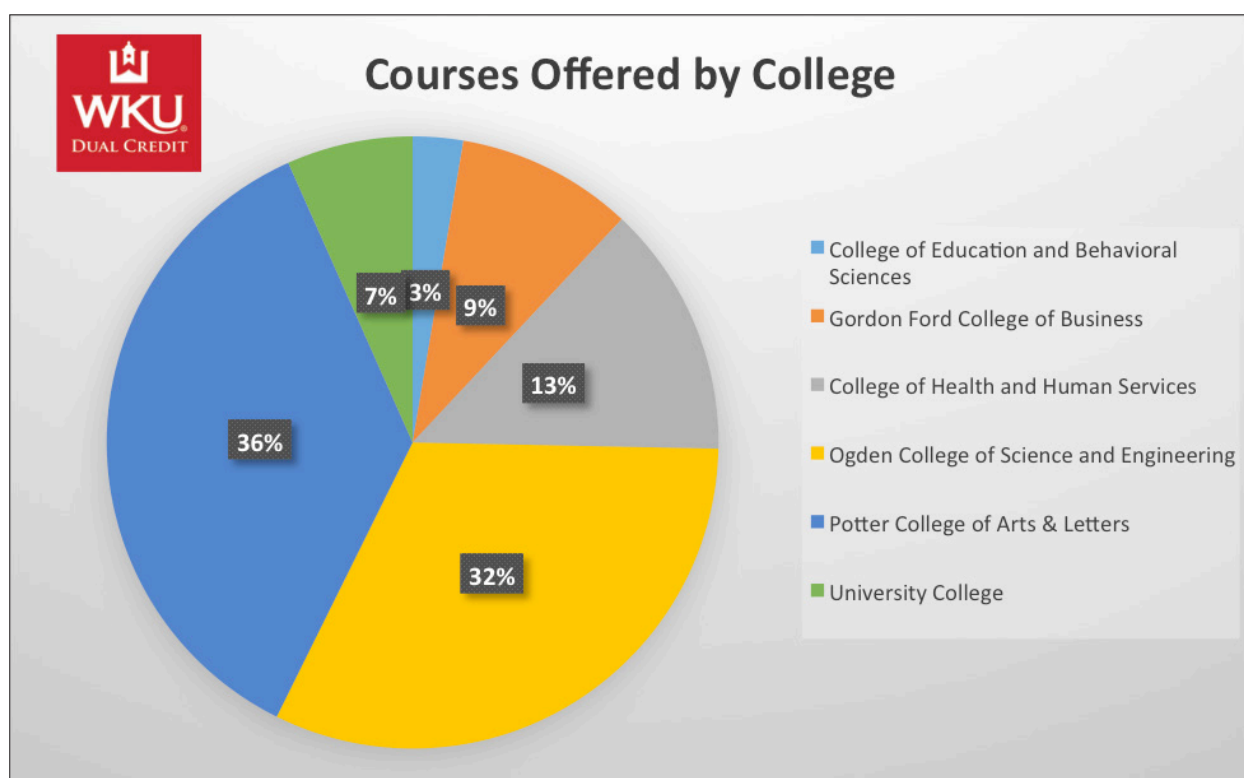

New Dual Credit Scholarship

The State implemented a Dual Credit Scholarship for 2016-17 that paid tuition for up to two courses for students at public Kentucky high schools. Students were awarded 3,304 WKU dual credit course scholarships. The program will be continued for the 2017-18 academic year.

GRREC-WKU Dual Credit Investing in Innovation (i3) Grant Partnership

The GRREC project funded by the grant is Get the Picture?!. The overall goal of the project is to increase college and career readiness of high school students with disabilities in nine rural, high-poverty high schools. This Spring, WKU Dual Credit provided scholarships for 70 participating high school students to enroll in a 1 credit hour course UC 100, College and Career Exploration. Rendy Belcher, Project Director, said “this opportunity has been impactful to both adults and children at the high school level.”

SUPPORT FEATURES

Faculty Liaison for Dual Credit Instructors

In each of our academic areas we strive to have a university faculty member serve as our academic liaison for dual credit teachers in their content area. The liaison's role is to guide and assist the dual credit teacher in the development of the WKU course, and also to serve as a resource for course content and academic feedback.

Centralized Office for Dual Credit

The Dual Credit Office serves as a central point of contact for students, their parents, high school teachers, guidance counselors, and other interested parties. Our staff is able to address most questions pertaining to Dual Credit, but when we are not we can connect our student/customer with the appropriate office or person.

WKU ID Card

Dual Credit students are “real” WKU students and, therefore, are able to obtain a university ID card. Many students take advantage of this opportunity which allows them to access WKU's libraries and academic resources at any WKU campus (Bowling Green, Elizabethtown, Glasgow, Owensboro) and online. Also, the ID cards provide a tangible means for high school students to feel connected to WKU and a part of the university's student body.

Campus Visits

We support our faculty partners with hosting and leading campus visits by dual credit students. We will work with their instructors and the university departments to create personalized and even discipline-specific visits to WKU's Bowling Green campus.

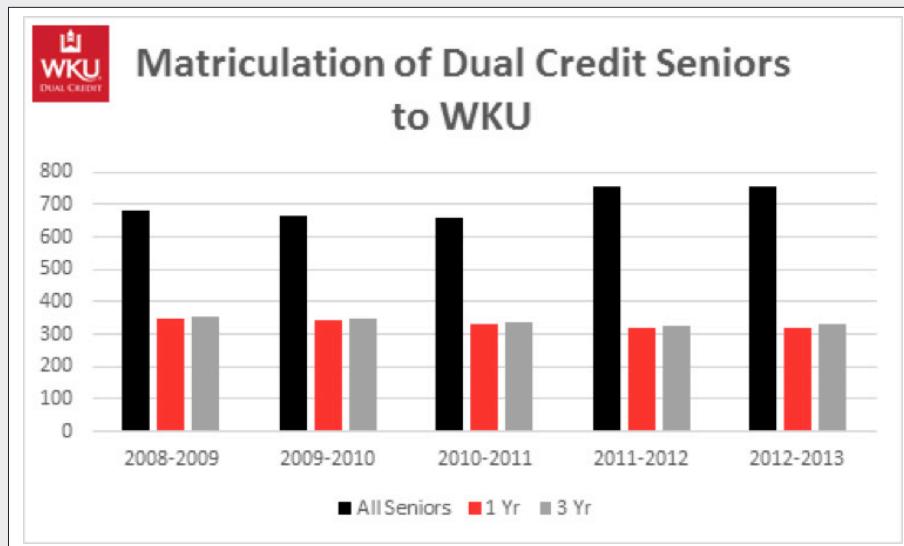
Academic Professional Workshops

Dual Credit supports our academic partners in their efforts to provide collaborative discipline-specific workshops. While the academic departments will address content-related information for their instructors, Dual Credit sponsors the events through stipends to instructors for attending, arranging the location, and ensuring that food and drink details are taken care of.

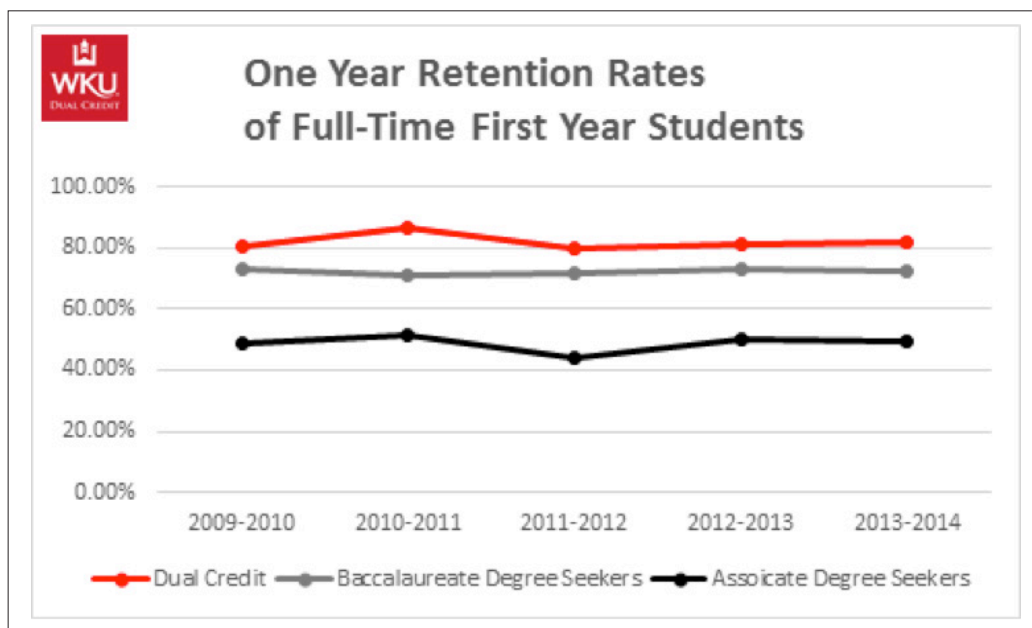
Student Matriculation



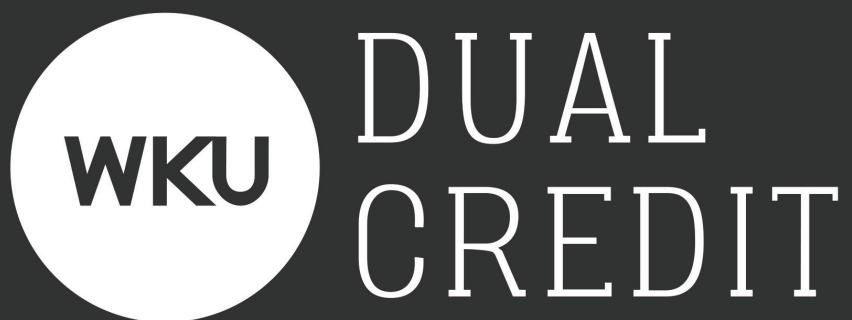
(Matriculation of high school seniors with WKU Dual Credit coursework to WKU within one year of high school graduation and within three years of high school graduation)

- Students at the low end of the GPA spectrum listed (3.0 down to < 2.0) do not matriculate to WKU. I would predict, though, that very few of them move on to college at any institution.
- The highest percentage of high school students matriculating to WKU are from the middle of the road on the GPA scale. Students earning a 3.5 – 4.0 come to WKU at a higher rate (46%), followed by 2.5 – 3.0 (42%), followed by the 4.0 group (41%). I presume that the higher performing students are awarded scholarships at other institutions which accounts for their relatively low percentage of matriculation.
- The average matriculation rate of all GPA levels is 38%.

- Regarding the local high schools:
 - Bowling Green HS – 44%
 - Greenwood HS – 50%
 - South Warren HS – 50%
 - Warren Central HS – 56%
 - Warren East HS – 44%
