## Master of Arts in English with a Literature Concentration

(30-33 hours)\

## Admission requirements

In addition to Graduate Studies requirements, applicants should have 27 hours of undergraduate English with a 3.0 or better and a score of at least 4.0 on the GRE Analytical Writing section. Students seeking Rank II or Rank I certification for Grades 8-12 must possess a secondary school teaching certificate and should include a copy with their application.

## **Program Requirements**

No more than 12 hours of 400/G graduate courses are allowed.

Six hours of poetry and six hours of fiction are required.

Students seeking Rank II or Rank I certification are required to incorporate pedagogy into their research papers in at least six hours of American and six hours of British literature classes.
