Master of Arts in English with a Rhetoric and Composition Concentration

(30-33 hours)

Admission requirements

In addition to Graduate Studies requirements, applicants must have completed a minimum of four undergraduate English courses beyond general education requirements, at least two being upper-level literature courses. Academically defensible alternatives may be acceptable. Applicants must have at least a 3.0 or better in undergraduate English classes and a score of at least 4.0 on the GRE Analytical Writing section. Students seeking Rank II or Rank I certification for grades 8-12 must possess a secondary school teaching certificate and must include a copy with the application for admission.

Program Requirements

No more than 12 hours of 400/G graduate courses are allowed.

Students seeking Rank II or Rank I certification are required to incorporate pedagogy into their research papers in the six hours of American and six hours of British literature.
