

His nonfiction books include Pax Intrantibus: A Meditation on the Poetry of Thomas Merton; Poetry & Compassion: Essays on Art & Craft; and Craft-talk: On Writing Poetry. His work has appeared in many leading journals, including Poetry, American Poetry Review, The Hudson Review, The Iowa Review, The Writers Chronicle, Shenandoah, and The Southern Review. He serves as Associate Professor of English at Bellarmine University, where he received the 2005 Wyatt Faculty Award, and lives in Louisville with his wife, the poet and memoirist Olga-Maria Cruz.
