Governor Establishes Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship



Gov. Matt Bevin established the Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship to assist Kentuckians learn skills needed in particular industries. An applicant must have a high school diploma or GED and NOT have an associates or higher degree.


For the 2017-2018 school year, the scholarship can be used to study for a certificate, credential, diploma or an associate's degree in one of five key areas: health care, advanced manufacturing, transportation/logistics, business services/information technology, or construction.

Students can receive the scholarship for up to four semesters, until they have earned at least 12 credit hours, or until they have received an associate's degree.

To keep the scholarship, students must earn at least a 2.0 GPA each semester. The scholarship will be administered by KHEAA (Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority). The application will be available on **kheaa.com** later this spring.
