Remember, students MUST meet with their advisor before being able to register for classes, so make an appointment soon.



iCAP Tips

- Click on the courses underlined in blue to read the course title, description, and how many credit hours it's worth.
- Your advisor's name is at the very top of your iCAP, and their email is at the very bottom.
- IP stands for "in progress." Your final grade for the course will replace the IP.
- Don't forget to bring your iCAP with you to an advising appointment!

What is an iCAP?

iCAP is an acronym for Interactive Curriculum and Academic Progress.

By running an iCAP on TopNet, you can obtain a personalized, interactive audit displaying progress toward a selected degree.

An audit shows all the requirements needed to fulfill a major, a minor, a concentration, or general education requirements, and displays the transfer and WKU courses that have been used to satisfy those requirements. You can

also run "What-If" audits to compare your coursework against other majors.

If you have completed a category, you will see a green checkmark next to it. If you have not completed a category, you will see a red "X." Within each section, you will see plus and minus signs. A plus sign means that particular requirement of that category has been fulfilled, but a minus sign means that particular requirement has not yet been fulfilled.

Your iCAP should also show you what grade you earned for the course, what classes have transferred from other institutions, and what classes you have been given credit for due to test scores such as the ACT, AP, or CLEP.

To run an iCAP, login to TopNet and click on Student Services. Then click on iCAP (Interactive Degree Audit) or iCAP General Education Audit.
