Get Advised for Spring Classes!

Start thinking about what classes you want to take next semester: your registration date is just around the corner. Use the box at the right to determine what day you will be able to register on TopNet.

Now that you know when you'll be able to register for classes, schedule an appointment with your academic advisor. Call 270-745-5065 (the AARC) if you are an Exploratory student.

It is **MANDATORY** that you meet with your advisor before registration. A hold will be placed on your account that will prevent you from registering for any classes. Only your advisor can remove this hold.

Before you meet with your

advisor, print out your iCAP on TopNet to see what requirements you have already fulfilled and what requirements you still need to fulfill.

Try to pick out some classes ahead of time that you're interested in taking.

Think about what major you want to pursue. Your advisor can help you find introductory courses to that major if you're still unsure
