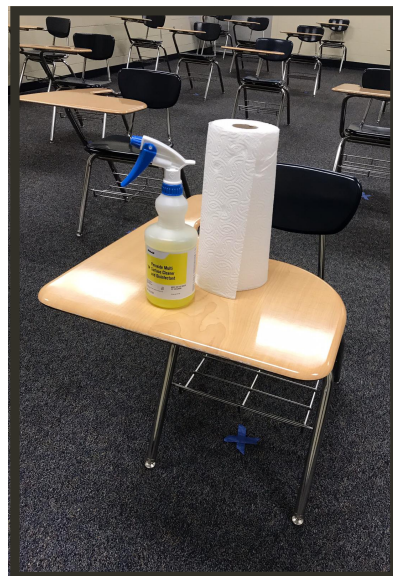
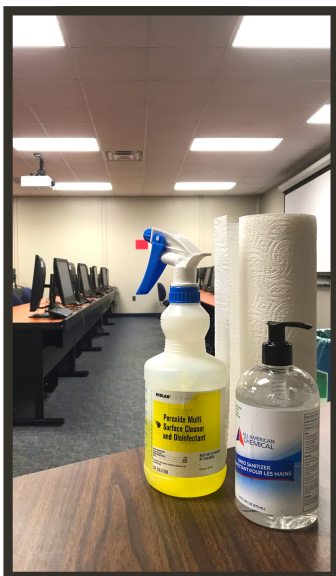


COVID-19 Response

Implementing a Comprehensive Plan

DFM has been busy preparing WKU's campus for in person classes! While June operations focused on providing disinfectant kits for faculty and staff offices, July and August were all about the students. DFM has provided immense value to the campus by coordinating the distribution of bulk hand sanitizer stations across campus, ordering and hanging safety signage, and staging disinfectant materials in all labs and classrooms. All of these endeavors contributed to WKU's readiness to resume in person classes.



Every classroom is equipped with at least 1 bottle of disinfectant spray and 1 roll of paper towels. These materials are designated for disinfecting classrooms in between ESA cleanings. Classrooms with shared equipment, like computers or machinery, are also provided two 16oz bottles of hand sanitizer.

DFM has placed 498 bottles of disinfectant in classrooms, Zoom rooms, computer labs and graduate labs across campus.

DFM has delivered a total of 249 office disinfectant kits to faculty and staff.

DFM printed hand washing signs, elevator occupancy signs, face masks required signs, physical distancing signs and health check signs. These signs are posted at every building to communicate public safety expectations.



Hand sanitizer dispensers are located at the primary entrance to all large buildings and throughout high-traffic areas. These stations are routinely serviced by ESA staff.
