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A short letter from the WKU Family Child Care Network:

The staff from the **FCCN** at **WKU** are excited to offer a variety of training sessions using an online learning management system. Online venues allow individuals to sign up for training that not only meets their technology needs, but also allows them to do the work from their program or home without having to travel. Because online training is not tightly scheduled, you can also complete the training at a time most convenient for you!

Training courses have a prerecorded training which may also include multiple sources of information and activities. Online classes run monthly, and participants have approximately two weeks to complete them, depending on the course. Once the training is successfully completed and ends for the month, ECE TRIS credit is awarded. ECE TRIS credited is awarded within 10 business days of the course end date, not individual completion date. Course end dates are usually the last day of the month.

Once you have chosen a topic that meets your needs, register online at https://www.wku.edu/fccn/. Due to the requirements of the Information Technology administrators, registrations must be received no later than 5 working days before each session begin date. Registrations received less than 5 working days before the session will be registered the following month, unless other arrangements have been made.

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS:

- This is an "individual participation" event. Participants must register individually and must have their own current, valid, and active personal e-mail address to participate.
- Groups of individuals cannot participate using a single e-mail address.
- Delays in accessing the training may occur based upon the speed and reliability of their Internet access. We recommend a high-speed connection to view videos.

If you have already taken one of our training modules, then look through our extensive list to take a new session! Participants are only eligible to complete a specific module one time.

Although this is online and an independent study, we do not want you to feel alone.

Curriculum-based Assessment

Curriculum-based assessment is a process of gathering information about a child from a variety of sources, reviewing the information, and then using the information to plan educational activities for an individual child or a group of children. This allows the activities to be at a level the child(ren) can understand and is(are) able to learn from.

Assessment is a critical part of a high-quality, early childhood program. By using the assessment process in an ongoing format and assessing development stages, we can observe and track each child to get information about what he or she knows and what he or she can do. This helps us meet the needs of all children in our curriculum and lesson planning.

Objectives:

- Participants will learn the difference between screening and assessment.
- Participants will learn the purpose of assessment.
- Participants will learn what assessment measures.
- Participants will learn how to implement some informal methods of assessment.
- Participants will learn why assessment is a cycle and not an event.

Developmental Screening

Developmental screening is the first step in understanding where each child is in all developmental domains. Participants will explore the screening process and better understand the importance of screening in Early Childhood settings. They will also examine the follow up and referral process, and the way the child's results impact those steps.

Objectives:

- Participants will be able to identify what screening is.
- Participants will understand the purpose of screening and why the results are important.
- Participants will learn what developmental domains are covered in the screening process.
- Participants will be able to identify what results they may see, and the steps to take according to the child's result.
- Participants will learn how to cultivate conversation and trust with families when discussing screening results and next steps.
- Participants will explore examples of screenings tools and general screening processes.
