


This is Joey

However, in January, his car broke down and he missed his third Spanish class.




In February, he missed a study session to spend Valentine's Day with his girlfriend Sally.

What Do I Need to Know?

In order to keep your financial aid, you (the student) must maintain certain academic requirements

Academics

Making Good Grades Is Important

Per federal guidelines, the school must evaluate your academic progress for every academic semester that you are enrolled

Satisfactory Academic Progress

Learning About SAP Is Important


Students who do not meet SAP requirements may lose their financial aid

Financial Aid

Keeping Your Financial Aid Is Important

What are the SAP Requirements?

Earn at least a 2.0 GPA (WKU/Overall)



Earn at least 67% of your Attempted Hours



Probability of retaining your financial aid the following academic semester

GOOD GPA

GOOD PACE

GOOD SAP

What happens if I do not meet SAP Requirements?

You may be placed on SAP Warning for the following academic semester

This means that you must bring your WKU/Overall GPA and Overall Pace up to SAP Requirements within your one semester of SAP Warning

If you do not meet min. SAP requirements within your one SAP Warning semester, you may lose your financial aid

This means that you may have to pay for school out of pocket until you are able to reach SAP requirements
