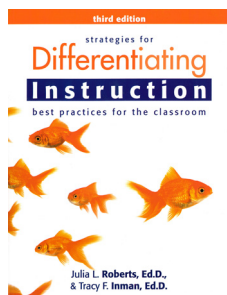


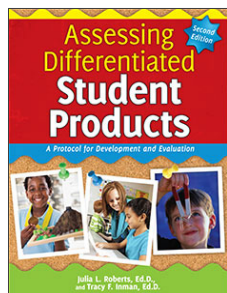
Differentiation Workshop

A Differentiated Professional Learning Opportunity on Differentiation:

A Workshop for Teachers New to Differentiation and a Workshop for Teachers Ready for the Next Level



Educators know the importance of matching the learning to the student, but not all understand how to make that happen in their classrooms or schools. Others do understand and already apply differentiated instruction, but they are ready for the next level. Presenters Julia Roberts and Tracy Inman specialize in differentiating to meet the needs of all students, including those with gifts and talents. Participants will self-assess to select the workshop best fitting their needs.



Participants new to differentiation may attend the beginning workshop. Dr. Julia Roberts is the Mahurin Professor of Gifted Studies at Western Kentucky University where she also serves as Executive Director of The Center for Gifted Studies and The Carol Martin Gatton Academy of Mathematics and Science. In the last 10 years, Roberts has written eight books on gifted education and contributed numerous chapters and journal articles. She serves on the boards of the Kentucky Association for Gifted Education and The Association for the Gifted (a division of the Council for Exceptional Children), and she is president of the World Council for Gifted and Talented Children.



Dr. Tracy Inman has presented on the state, national, and international levels, trained thousands of teachers in differentiation and gifted education and published multiple books and articles. She has taught on both the high school and collegiate levels as well as in summer programs for gifted and talented youth. She currently serves as the Associate Director of The Center for Gifted Studies and holds positions on the boards of The Association for the Gifted (a division of the Council for Exceptional Children), the Kentucky Association for Gifted Education, and The National Association for Gifted Children.
