Dear Prospective Applicant:

We are pleased that you are interested in the Health Information Management (HIM) Program. This associate degree program (major #243) requires completion of 62 semester hours. You are encouraged to visit the website of the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) at www.ahima.org for information describing the health information management field. Additional materials are available at https://www.wku.edu/healthinformationmanagement/ and will answer many of the questions that you may have about the HIM program.

Enrollment in this program is limited. Applicants must successfully complete the introductory course, HIM 100-Health Data Content and Structure, with a grade of C or higher before being considered for acceptance to the program. Applications are due by May 1st of each year for the fall semester and by December 1st of each year for the spring semester.

To apply for the next class, you must follow the application procedures. As part of the application process, you will visit a medical record/health information department in a healthcare facility of your choice. An appointment should be made with the person in charge of the medical record/health information department, either a Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT) or a Registered Health Information Administrator (RHIA). The purpose of this visit is to learn more about the profession and the day-to-day operations of the department.

Students who are enrolled in the HIM 100 course are expected to have a satisfactory scholastic record, to be responsible for any costs associated with the HIM program and to provide the following medical documentation before September 15th if enrolled in the fall semester and before February 15th if enrolled in the spring semester:

- Proof of mumps, measles, and rubella immunity by positive antibody titers or two doses of the MMR vaccine
- Varicella immunity by positive antibody titer or proof of varicella immunization
- Evidence of current immunizations against diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis within the last ten years
- Proof of hepatitis B immunization or declination of vaccine
- Tuberculin skin test and/or chest x-ray within the past 12 months; follow-up provided appropriate to the situation
- 7 or 10 panel drug screen
- Professional liability insurance at an approximate cost of \$35.00 per year; students must keep insurance up-to-date throughout enrollment in the HIM program
- AHIMA student membership at an approximate cost of 35.00 per year; students must maintain membership throughout enrollment in the HIM program
- Results of a criminal background check

As the final course of study, students are required to complete one five-week professional practice experience (HIM 295-Seminar & Professional Practice Experience). Students are responsible for living and travel expense during the professional practice experience. Individual professional practice site may require additional medical documentation and the student will be responsible for any associated costs.

In addition, prior to enrollment in HIM 295, students must submit the results of a second drug screen and second criminal background check. Students should be aware that healthcare agencies have the right to refuse clinical placement at their facility if a student has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor. If a professional practice facility refuses student access due to a criminal conviction, the student will be unable to meet the requirements for completion of the Health Information Management Program.
