## **Incorporating the Museum into Your Course**

There are many ways that you can integrate the museum into class exercises to help students engage with your major course concepts and themes.

## **Suggested Activities for Museum Tours**

These activities complement many different course topics and themes by subject professor asking students to view exhibit materials from a new perspective.

## **Context Matters**

**Subject professors** have students choose a particular item in the exhibit and analyze how the item is influenced by its context. Students may be asked to focus on a particular social, historical, or cultural context, the item's creation or reception, or the item's placement in the museum. This activity is great for comparing perspectives and creating respectful discussion regarding different viewpoints.

## **Connecting Concepts**

**Subject professors** give their students a particular issue or theme to search for in the exhibit. Each student chooses an item they feel best expresses or address that issue/theme and writes a brief summary explaining why they chose that item. Responses are then shared and discussed with the class. This activity is great for evaluating concept comprehension and application.
