NATIVE AMERICAN CLOTHING FOR WOMEN



Hair pulled back and wrapped with silk ribbon, leather, or wool. Women would sometimes wear items such as trade silver, and thimbles in their hair.

Common trade shirt. Both men and women wore shirts like these.

Beaded necklace. Beads were obtained through trade.

Wrap skirt. Skirts were commonly made of wool and the edges were bound with silk ribbon.

Pucker-toe center seam moccasins.



Highly decorated pucker-toe moccasins. These style moccasins would have been worn by men, women and children on special occasions. They are decorated with dyed porcupine quillwork and dyed deer hair inside tin cones.
