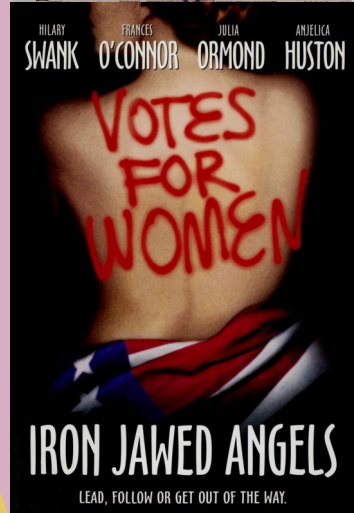
Iron Jawed Angels 6:00 pm
