Many enjoy the laid back environment of clubs. Jackson Woods, a sophmore who's a member of the 'Video Game Club' shares an interesting story.


"It started out as 'Smash Bros Club' but after winter break we re-branded to 'Video Game Club," to attract new members," said Jackson Woods, 9.


