



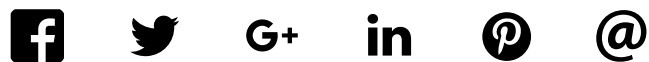

GLASGOW — Prospective Hilltoppers were given an opportunity Thursday afternoon to see what it might be like to become a WKU-Glasgow student.

The event was the first of its kind for WKU-Glasgow to host.

“The purpose of the event is to inform people within the region. WKU-Glasgow serves 13 counties in Kentucky and two in Tennessee. What we are trying to do is just get the word out about what we offer as far as academic programs, our services, our resources to help people not only achieve a college degree but transform their lives and increase the quality of their life,” said John Roberts, coordinator for student affairs.

Those who attended the event got to know the WKU-Glasgow team, see the campus and learn more about what it's like to be a student there. They also got some hints and tips about how to be successful in college and how to make the most of their college making decision, he said.

Turnout for Thursday's event was low.
