

## Colonnade Program at Western Kentucky University Demonstrate Novice High Proficiency in a World Language

*Novice High means: I can communicate and exchange information about familiar topics using phrases and simple sentences, sometimes supported by memorized language. I can usually handle short social interactions in everyday situations by asking and answering simple questions.*

You choose:

- Demonstrate your skills.

Language background and test options:

4 years	AP of 3 or higher
3 or more	CLEP of 50 or higher
At least 2	STAMP of NH or higher

- Continue a language you already started. See placement info at the Modern Languages web site. Complete a 102 or higher course with a C or better.\*

- Start a new language. Options:  
**Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Korean\*\*, Russian, and Spanish.**  
Take 101 and 102. Earn a C or higher. See additional options below.

You must complete the requirement before you have earned 60 hours of college credit. 92% of fall 2015 freshmen who had 2 years of high school language and took the STAMP test were able to demonstrate Novice High proficiency. STAMP fulfills the requirement. It does not award credit. An adequate CLEP or AP score does both. Additional courses outside Modern Languages that fulfill the requirement: ASL 102 or higher, CHNF 101 or higher, Greek (RELS/BLNG 155), Hebrew RELS/BLNG 153), Latin (RELS 151), and Pali (RELS 157). \*Modern Languages courses taught in English (any language 105, CHIN 108, JAPN 115, SPAN 200) do not fulfill the requirement. See the 2015-16 UG Catalog p. 43. \*\* Pending Colonnade approval.
