 Fall Semester 2014 course w/trip to Missoula (Sept 30-Oct 4)

Program cost (\$1,495) includes: 3 full days of fly fishing and instruction (float trips with one guide and 2 anglers/boat), use of fly fishing equipment (rod, reel, etc.), terminal tackle (leader, tippet, flies), guide gratuity, 4 nights lodging, most meals, and Missoula airport hotel shuttle. Transportation to/from Missoula, MT not included in program cost.
