Drug & Alcohol Task Group – Rafael Casas – Increase in police presence. Michael Crowe has stepped up student conduct. Issues on top floor of new parking structure. Drugs dropped from #1-2 to #5 as problem on campus. Looking at demographics of students getting in trouble. Grocery Bingo for students focusing on sexual assault & alcohol & drug overdose.

Emergency Preparedness Task Group – David Oliver –Group speaking @National Center for Spectator Sports in Louisville on success @game day events. National Weather Service meeting re potential partnerships – deploy students into community during storm events to conduct damage assessment for National Weather Service. Set up cooling stations for commencement. Active Shooter pilot integrated training with FD, EMS, & PD to increase communication of responders. Preplan every building on campus with staging areas and command post locations.
