RESOLVED THAT Western Kentucky University should, as befits its stature as a leading American university with international reach, vigorously and publicly defend the integrity and rights of our students as they develop their skills in research, scholarship and creative activities, as well as the academic freedom of the faculty who encourage those developing skills; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT If and when controversies arise, the faculty, students, and administration of Western Kentucky University should seek to use the opportunity to encourage fruitful dialogue and debate among the faculty and students in order to enhance our capacity to achieve real learning outcomes; and finally, be it

RESOLVED THAT The University Senate requests that President Ransdell provide a response to this resolution in a timely manner.
