Catalog statement of existing policy: The Colonnade general education foreign language requirements will be waived for students whose first language is not English, contingent upon successful completion of ENG 100, ENG 300 (or an approved 200-level or higher Writing in the Disciplines course), COMM 145 and an additional 3 hours of coursework in Exploration or Connections courses as long as the course selected is not a foreign language class in the student's native language. A letter from the Office of International Programs verifying the student is a non-native speaker of English must be attached to the iCAP undergraduate degree exception form and submitted to the Office of the Registrar
- 2. Catalog statement of proposed policy: The Colonnade general education foreign language requirements will be waived for students whose first language is not English, contingent upon successful completion of ENG 100, ENG 300 (or an approved 200-level or higher Writing in the Disciplines course), and COMM 145. A letter from the Office of International Programs verifying the student is a non-native speaker of English must be attached to the iCAP undergraduate degree exception form and submitted to the Office of the Registrar.
- **Rationale for proposed policy revision:** The requirement of an additional Explorations or Connections course is being removed. The Colonnade Implementation Committee only wishes to require that non-native English speakers show proficiency in English.
